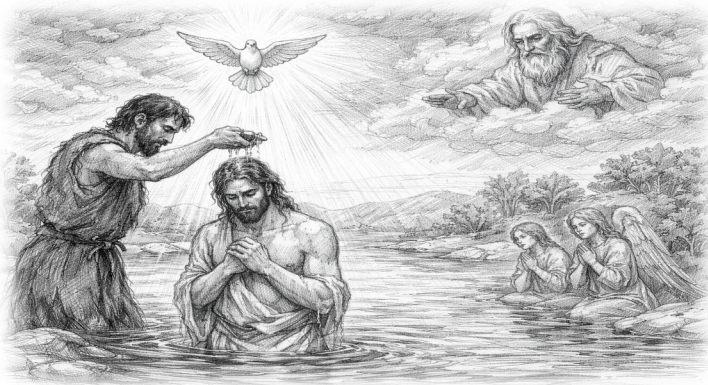

Background of the Gospel

The baptism of Jesus is attested to in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke. The account that appears in Matthew is the only one to include the dialogue between Jesus and John, however. Another difference in Matthew's presentation of this event is the announcement made by the voice from heaven, which says, "This is my beloved son . . ." In Mark and Luke, this voice addresses itself to Jesus: "You are my beloved son . . ."

The baptisms that John performs prefigure Christian Baptism. John baptizes for repentance from sin. In accepting this baptism, Jesus unites himself with all sinners even though he is sinless. In Matthew's Gospel, John the Baptist distinguishes his practice of baptism from the Baptism that the Messiah brings: "I am baptizing you with water . . . He will baptize you with the holy Spirit and fire" (Matthew 3:11).

The baptism of Jesus is another manifestation of Christ, another epiphany. Christ's baptism inaugurates his mission. In an analogous way, our Baptism inaugurates our mission as Christians.

This Sunday marks a transition from the Christmas season to Ordinary Time. In a way, today's feast is the high point of the Christmas season. Before Jesus' birth, angels announced to Mary and to Joseph who Jesus would be. At his birth, the shepherds and the Magi recognize Jesus as the Messiah. At his baptism, Jesus accepts that he is God's son and inaugurates that mission.

The Baptism of the Lord

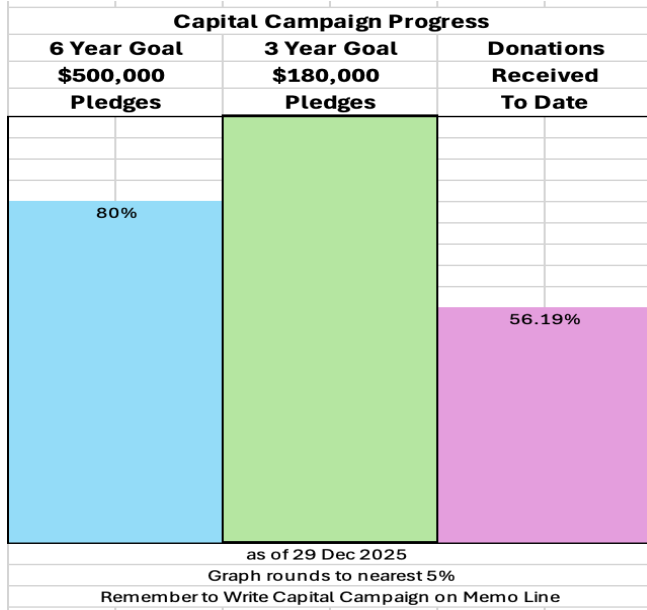
The **Baptism of the Lord** stands as the **third great manifestation of Jesus to the world**, following His birth at Christmas and His revelation to the nations at the Epiphany. At the Jordan River, Jesus steps into the waters not because He needs repentance, but because He fully embraces our human condition. He enters our brokenness to redeem it from within.

In this moment, heaven is opened. The Father's voice is heard: "*You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.*" The Holy Spirit descends like a dove. Here, God is revealed not only as Jesus the Son, but as **Trinity**—Father, Son, and Spirit—fully present and fully engaged in the salvation of the world. What was hidden for years in Nazareth is now made visible to all.

This manifestation is also deeply personal. In Jesus' baptism, we are reminded of our own. We, too, were named beloved sons and daughters. We, too, received the Spirit. The Baptism of the Lord reminds us that our faith is not meant to remain private or hidden. As Christ was revealed to the world, so are we sent to live and witness our identity as God's beloved walking in humility, faithfulness, and mission for others.

The children and I had a joyful and meaningful conversation about the Birth of Jesus and the feast of the Epiphany, using the Rosca de los Reyes as a bridge to faith. As we looked at the Rosca, we talked about how the circle reminds us of God's endless love, the fruits point to the gifts brought by the Magi, and the hidden baby Jesus invites us to *search for Christ* and to welcome Him into our lives. The Nativity set behind us came in handy as we named and reflected on each character—Mary and Joseph trusting God, the shepherds coming with simple hearts, and the Magi following the star. It helped the children see that Epiphany is not just a story from long ago, but a message for today: Jesus is revealed to everyone, and we are all invited to come and adore Him.
